2010	<p>Quarter 1: With the financial support of this grant. The James House assisted two families as they transitioned into a more stable living environment. A Hispanic mother with an income less than ver low was living in a Hopewell hotel with her two daughters. The James House provided the amount necessary for them to move into an apartment. Earning less than extremely low wages; a disabled female moved into her own residence with funds provided by the program. These families are now living free from domestic violence and actively engaged in teh healing process.</p> <p>Quarter 2: With the support of this grant, The James House assisted one family as they struggled to make ends meet. Inadequate heating in the home produced an unexpected jump in the electrical bill causing the family to be unable to pay the mortgage. Violence within the home has been an issue for several years. Following a recent incident of abuse, the mother contacted the James House. While she is living pay check to pay check, she is thankful that he is no longer in the home. This family is now learning about healthy relationships, coping skills, and communication. The mother plans to attend financial workshop classes.</p> <p>Quarter 3: The grant assisted one large family to establish a new life free from violence. The client was referred to the James House by the City Victim Witness Program. The protective order allowed the client and her children to remain in the home for 30 days. She has been able to find part time employment while her mother cares for one of her special needs child. The family was assisted with money required to move into their new home. The James House is providing case management, counseling, and on-going support for each member of this family.</p> <p>Quarter 4: Four families were helped during the 4th quarter. The first family consists of a mother and son. The mother has been a participatn in on of the support groups offered by the James House since last year. When she and her son left their abuser, the high balance transferred to her new residence did also. She requested financial support from the local churches, CHASM and the United Way but with no success. The James House worked in partnership with the Salvation Army to pay the enormous balance adn allow the family to start over.</p> <p>Assistance also provided to single working mother with four children.</p> <p>Assistance provided to another woman experiencing abuse by father.</p> <p>Another family assisted- single mother with three children.</p>
